
Lot 10 - Dairy Goat

Classes: Dry Does & Milk Does - Under/ Over 2 years

NO FEEDING OF GOATS IN PENS

1. All General Rules and Regulations apply to this department.
2. Negative Brucellosis and TB tests within 30 days are required, unless from a New Mexico certified free herd. Goats under 6 months of age are exempt from Brucellosis and TB test requirements. New Mexico Health Certification within 30 days. **BE SURE TO CHECK NM LIVESTOCK BOARD HEALTH RULES.**
3. Animals entered in the Youth Dairy Goat Show are not required to be registered with the American Dairy Goat Association.
4. Ear and tail web tattoos will be checked and must correspond with tattoos recorded on day of tagging.
5. Exhibitors are required to wear white while exhibiting animals in the ring.
6. All animals must have horns tipped to no larger than a dime.
7. All dairy goats must be declared in writing and tattoos recorded on the day of tagging. Any Exhibitor who wishes to show a doe that has not been born by the day of tagging must register August 1, 2022 and declare the dam on that day. As soon as they are able to be tattooed contact the Superintendent to record the tattoo. It is not necessary for the does to be present on the day of tagging unless they need to be tattooed. Declarations to show include the classes being entered.
8. The classes may be combined or divided as the chairman deems necessary.
9. Exhibitors are responsible for keeping pens neat and aisles clear at all times. Goats are to be maintained by the exhibitor throughout the Show, making sure they are well kept, well groomed, and in show condition. Public aisles and walkways must be kept clear of tack, chairs, equipment and animals.
10. Goats with sickness or abnormalities. The Livestock Committee reserves the right to reject goats showing signs of sickness, lice, ringworm, (or other skin conditions including those commonly known as "fungus") abscesses, ulcerations, abnormality or uncontrollable temperament. The Committee's decision is final and entry fees will not be refunded. The exhibitor must remove a rejected animal from the grounds immediately upon decision of the Committee.
